Facilities for Girls:

Shivaji College, Hingoli has always flourished with students. To avoid rush and other mishaps, separate provisions are made at various places for girls.

1. Parking Facilities:

A well observed parking of two-wheelers for girls is one of the disciplines in this college which is totally separate from Boys' parking.

2. Study Room:

Independent study row in the Reading Room always leads to the excellent performance of girls and a peon is appointed there to take care of all candidates studying in the reading room. Moreover, it is under the observation of CC TV

3. Separate Book-Issuing Centre:

The separate book-Issuing center marks a discipline of the college. It is also under the observation of CCTV cameras.



4. Stair Case:

The college has a separate staircase for girls contributing to disciplined management and it is under the observation of CCTV cameras too.

5. Ladies Common Room:

This is the most sensitive place now-a-days. Hence, the college has made a provision for girls resting mode in Ladies Room with CCTV cameras. There is an adequate place and silence kept for girls to study. The live CCTV footage is available on the cell phone of the IQAC coordinator. A notice board is also placed in Ladies Room

6. Girls Washroom:

At four different places girls' washrooms are situated in the college with ample supply of water and regular cleaning.



7. Drinking Water:

Girls can take the benefit of water coolers and water purifiers.

8. Canteen:

A separate section is made for girls for their convenience in the canteen. They have a space to enjoy their food and canteen food.

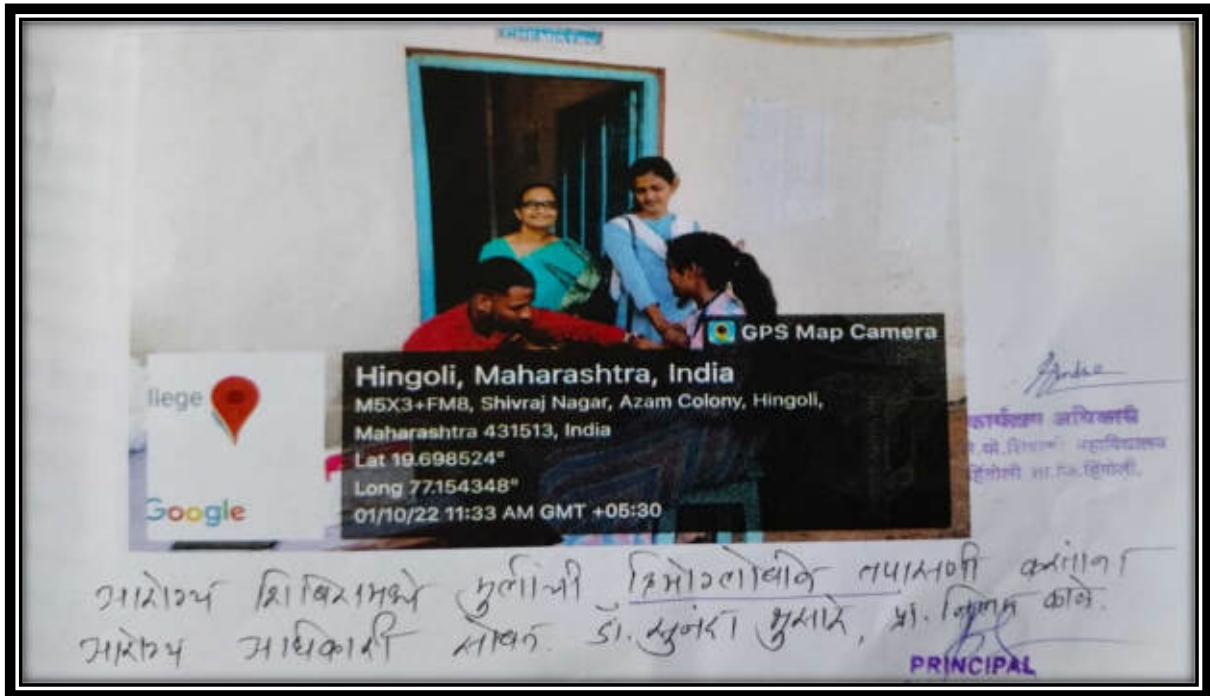


9. Health Care Center:

The college has a Health Care Center for both male and female faculties (Teaching and non-teaching) and students.

10. Health Camp for Ladies:-

Every year, the Health Checkup Camp is organized for ladies. Special Dental Check-up camp, Hemoglobin Check-up Camp, Hygiene Awareness Camp are the regular practices of the college. Almost 150 girl-students have been checked their Blood Group, Hemoglobin and Blood Pressure.



11. Health Checkup Camp for Girls:

Apart from regular parades and camps, NSS volunteers participated in social activities like Blood Donation Camp, AIDS Rally, Blood Donation Rally, Common Tree Plantation and Pulse Polio.

In 2022-23, a Free Health Checkup Camp was organized for women teachers and girls. The doctor from Government Hospital has taken the lipid profile of seventy-five of women teachers.

In 2022-23, the NSS Department was organized the Health Checkup Camp. One hundred and sixty girls have been checked with their Blood Group, Hemoglobin, Calcium, Blood Pressure, Actual Weight, Ideal Weight and Height.

12. Anti-Ragging Committee and Discipline:-

As the college is affiliated to the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded, some of its responsibilities are shared and covered by joint arrangements. The college publishes its regulations in prospectus. Ragging is a criminal offense and UGC has notified Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in highly educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. The college forms an Anti- Ragging and Discipline Committee. The students in distress owing to ragging related incidents can access the committee. In this committee one female and male teacher is the member and the Principal of the college performs his role as the chairperson.

GENDER BALANCE IN ENROLLEMENT AT GRADUATION LEVEL (2018-2023)

1. Year Wise Gender Classification

Gender-wise classification and analysis of the number of students admitted for degree classes in five academic years from 2018-2019 to 2022-2023 at Shivaji College Hingoli run by Shree Shivaji Shikshan Prasarak Mandal Hingoli.

In the academic year 2018-2019, the college had an Arts department. A total of 444 students were admitted in the first and third year of Arts. In this there were 257 boys and 187 girls.

In the academic year 2019-2020, the college had an arts department. A total of 373 students were admitted in first, second and third year of arts and first year of commerce and B Voc. In this there were 202 boys and 171 girls.

In the academic year 2020-2021, the college had Arts, Commerce and B Voc departments. A total of 404 students were admitted in first, second and third year of Arts and first year of Commerce and B Voc. In this there were 213 boys and 191 girls.

In the academic year 2021 - 2022, the college had a total of 568 students enrolled in first, second and third year of arts and commerce and first, second year of commerce and B Voc. In this there were 332 boys and 236 girls.

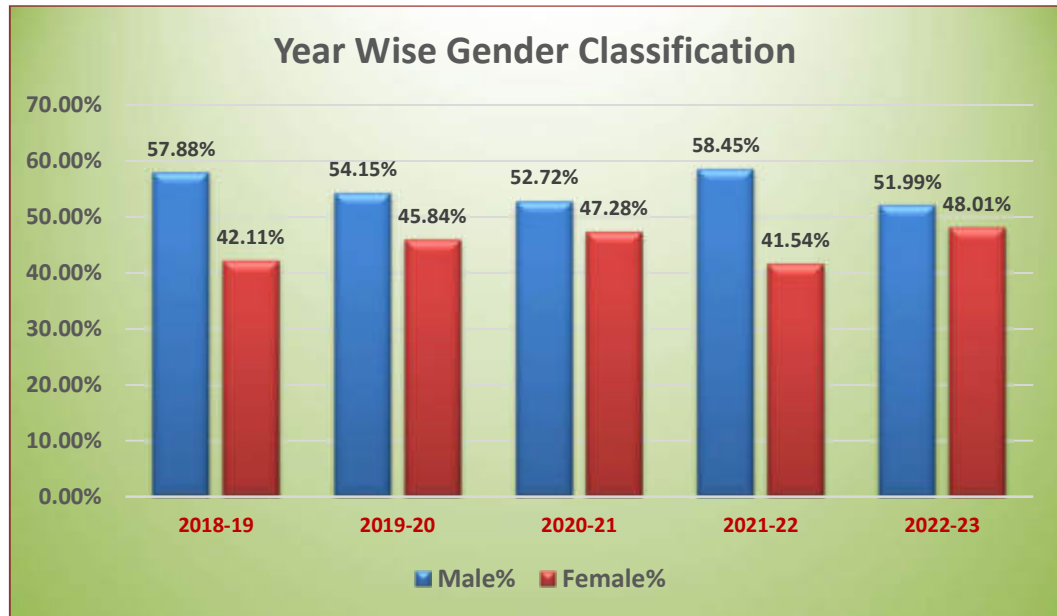
In the academic year 2022 - 2023, the college had an Arts department. A total of 477 students were admitted in first, second and third year of arts and first, second and third year of commerce B Voc. In this there were 248 boys and 229 girls.

In the above table number 01, the number of students admitted in the college and its proportion year wise has been shown. Graph No. 01 shows the year-wise proportion of students enrolled in the college. In the academic year 2018-19, a total of 447 students were admitted for BA first, second and third year. There were 187 girls numbering 42.11% of the total number of students.

In the academic year 2019-2020, a total of 373 students were admitted for BA first, second and third year. In this there were 171 girls whose number was 45.84% of the total number of students.

In the academic year 2020-2021, a total of 404 students were admitted for BA first, second and third year and B Com and B Voc first year. There were 191 girls in this. The total number of students was 47.28%.

In the academic year 2021-2022, a total of 568 students were admitted for BA first, second and third year and B.Com, B. Voc first year and second year. There were 236 girls. The total number of students was 41.54%.

In the academic year 2021-22 the enrollment of girls is less than 50%. A total of 477 students were admitted in the academic year 2022-2023. There were 229 girls. Its total number of students was 48.01%.

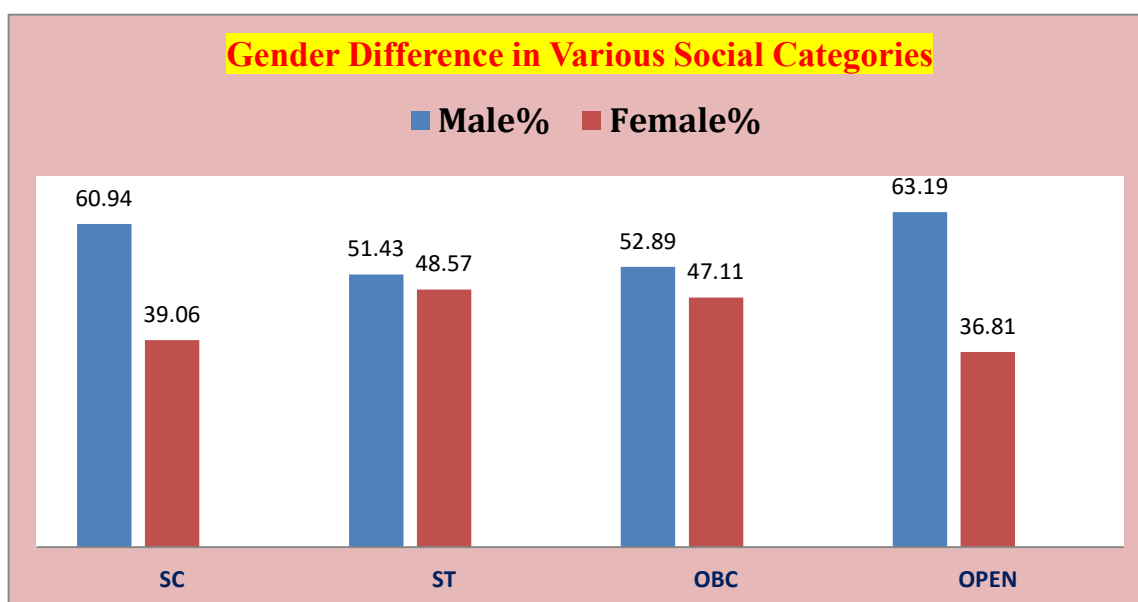
Gender Difference in Various Social Categories (2018-2019)

In the academic year 2018-2019 in Shivaji College Hingoli, there were 263 students admitted in B.A. first, second and third year. Among these admitted students, 128 Scheduled Castes, 35 Scheduled Tribes, 121 Other Backward Classes and 163 Open Category students were admitted. Among these 447 admitted students, 263 were boys and 184 were girl students. In this there were 128 students from Scheduled Caste category. There were 35 students from the Scheduled Tribe category. There were 121 students belonging to Other Backward Classes. There were 163 students in open category. All these students have been classified and analyzed category-wise and gender-wise by the table below.

In the above table, the students admitted in the academic year 2018-2019 have been classified and analyzed year-wise and category-wise. In 2018 - 2019 the total number of admitted students was 447. There were 184 girls in this. Analyzing the categorization of these 184 girls, it can be seen that 50 girls from the Scheduled Caste category were admitted. Its proportion among the total number of girls was 27.17 percent. 17 girls from Scheduled Tribes had taken admission. Its total proportion among girls was 9.27%. 57 girls from other backward categories had taken admission. Its proportion to the total number of students was 30.97%. 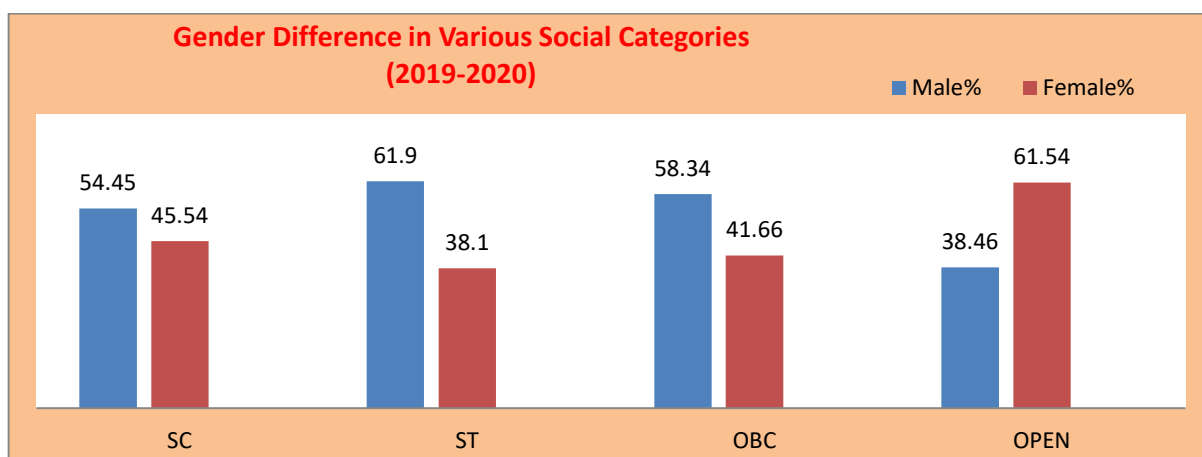
Gender Difference in Various Social Categories :- (2019-2020)

In the above table, the students admitted in the academic year 2019-2020 have been classified and analyzed year-wise and category-wise. In 2019 - 2020 the total number of admitted students was 373 out of which 171 were girls. 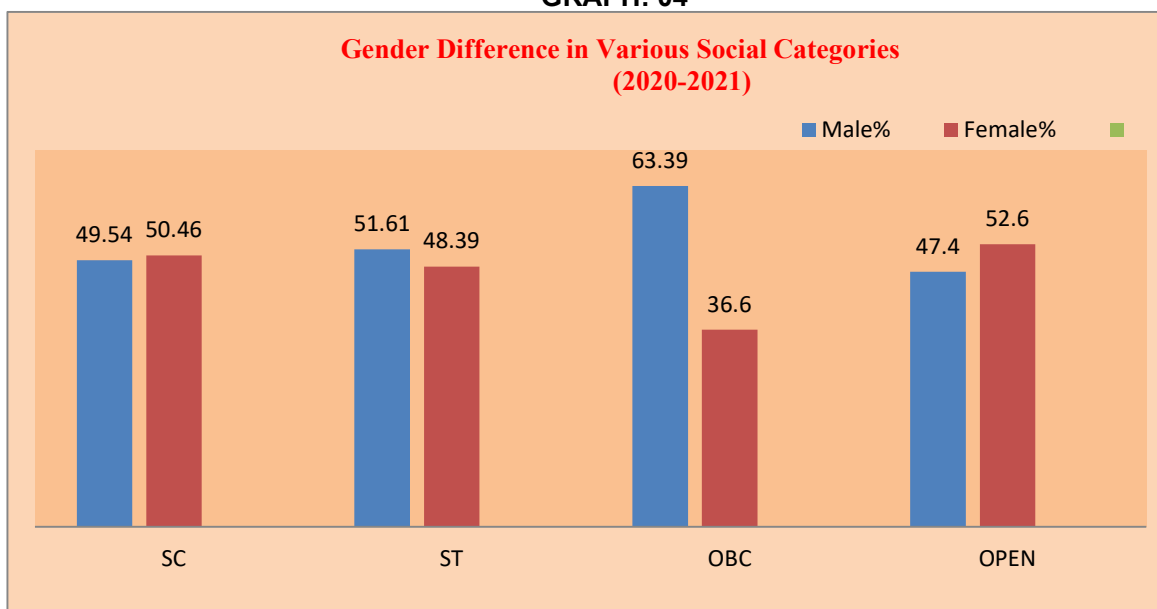
Gender Difference in Various Social Categories;-(2020-2021)

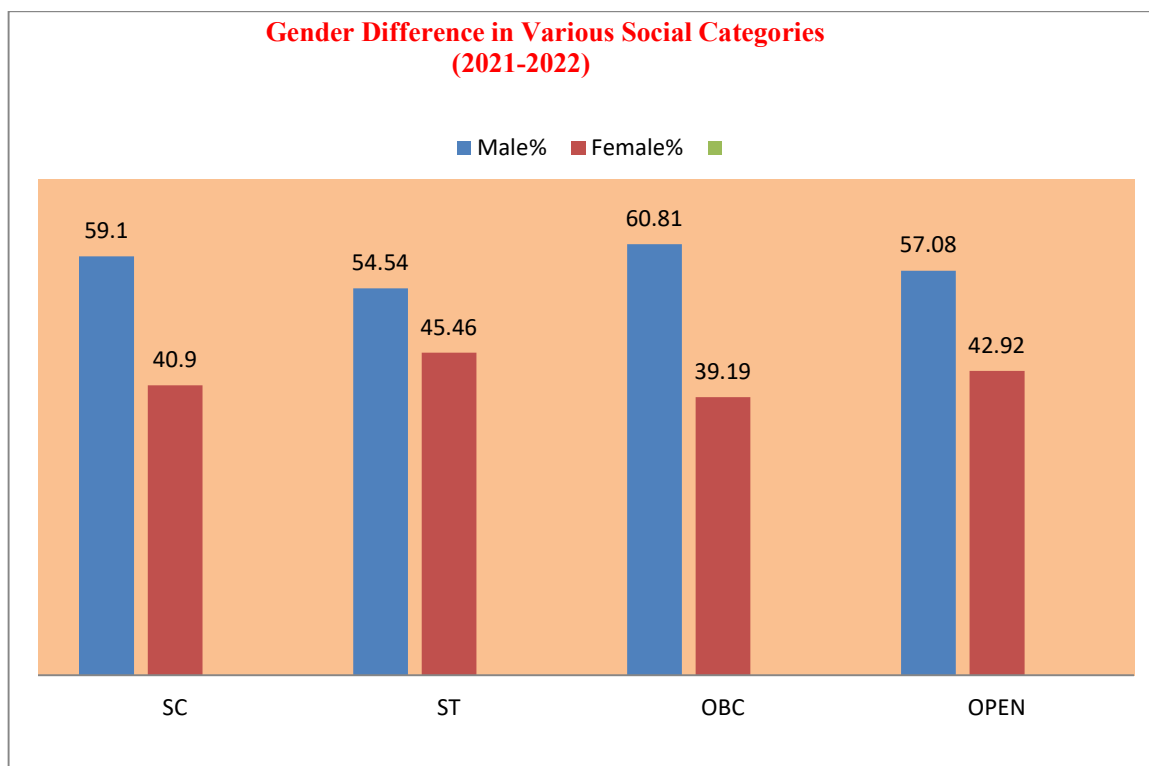
Gender Difference in Various Social Categories:-(2021-2022)

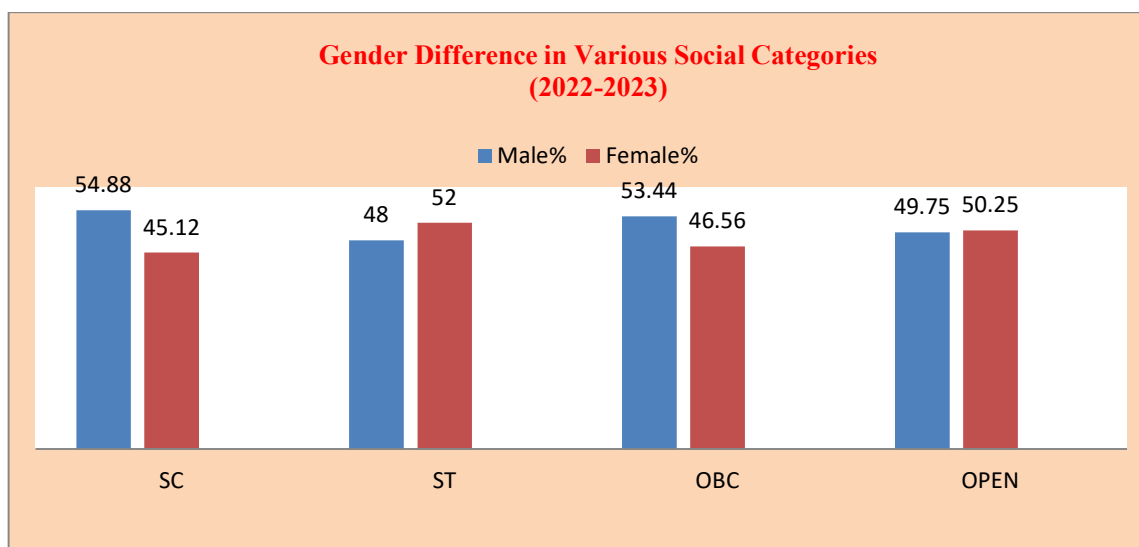
Gender Difference in Various Social Categories:- (2022-2023)

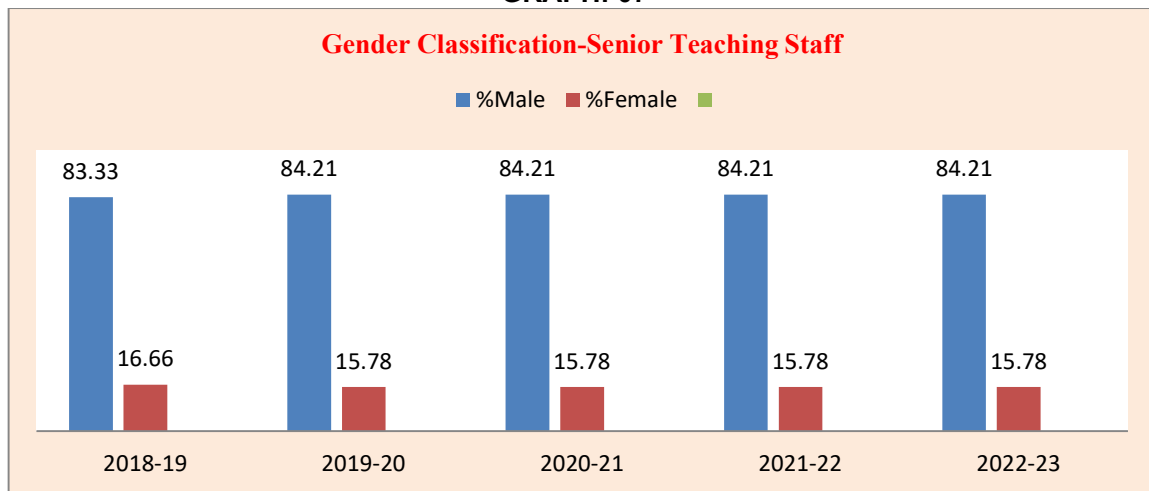

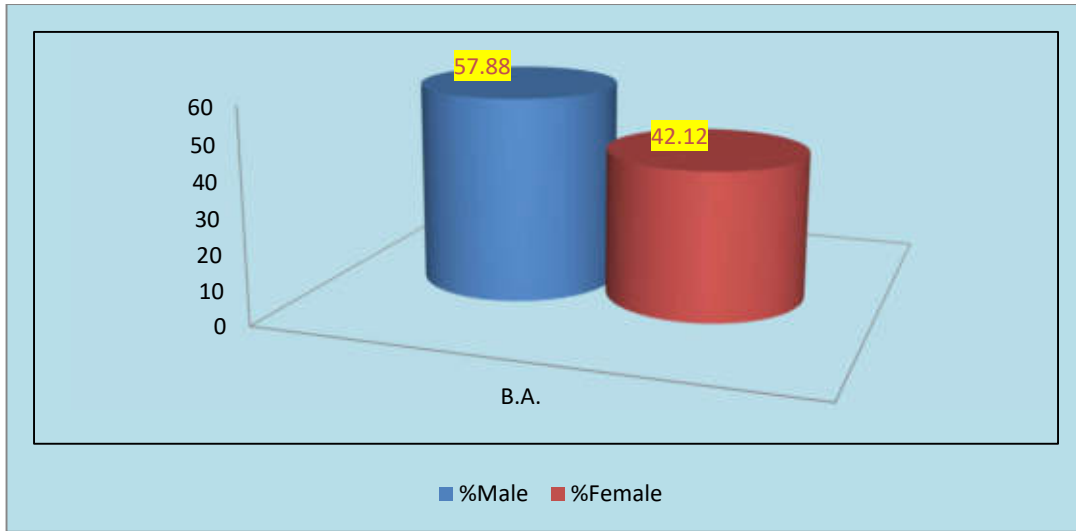

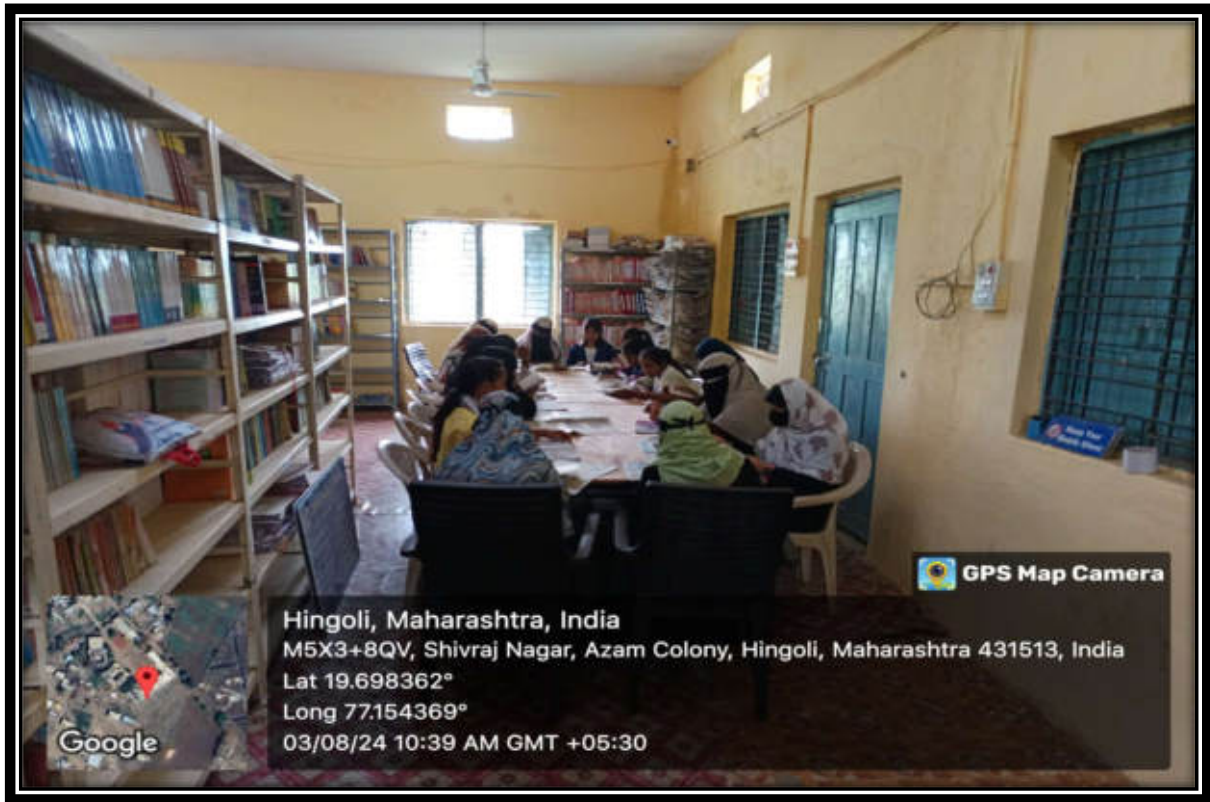

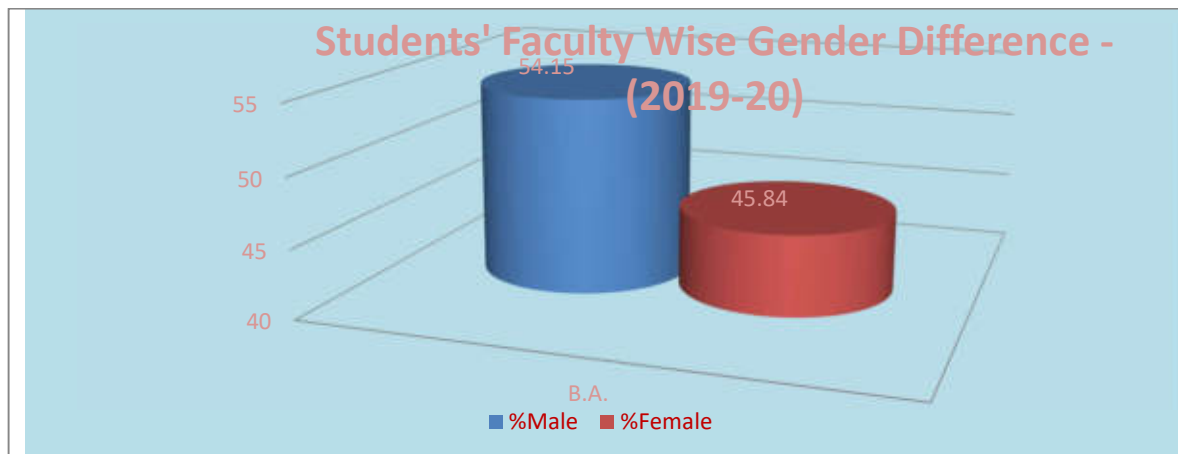

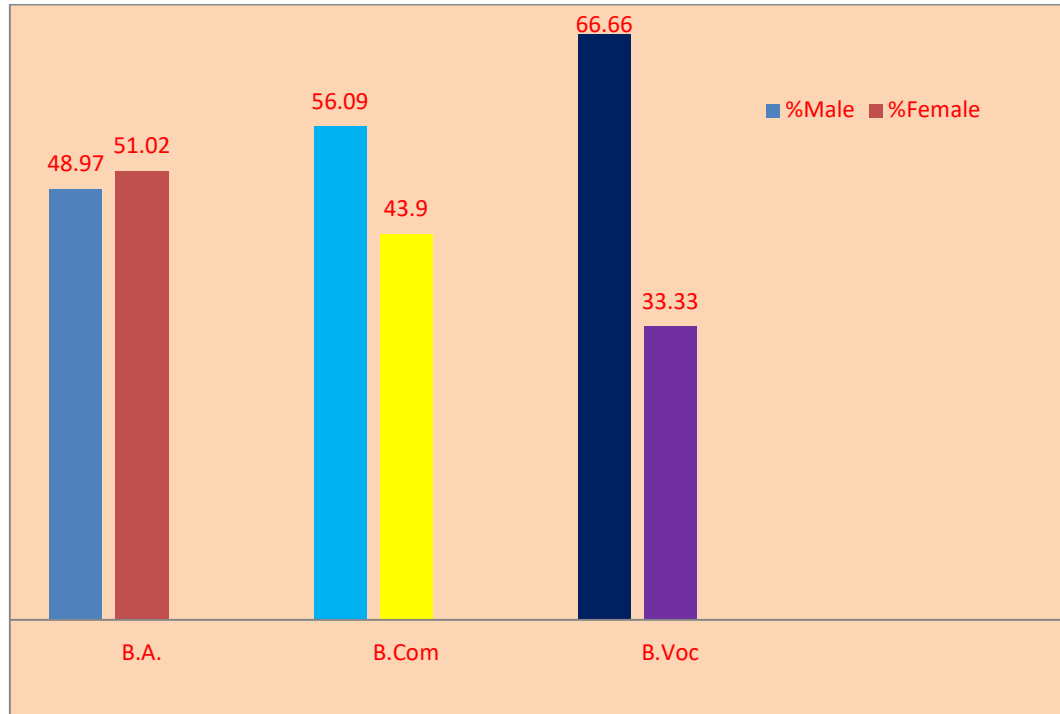

Students' Faculty Wise Gender Difference



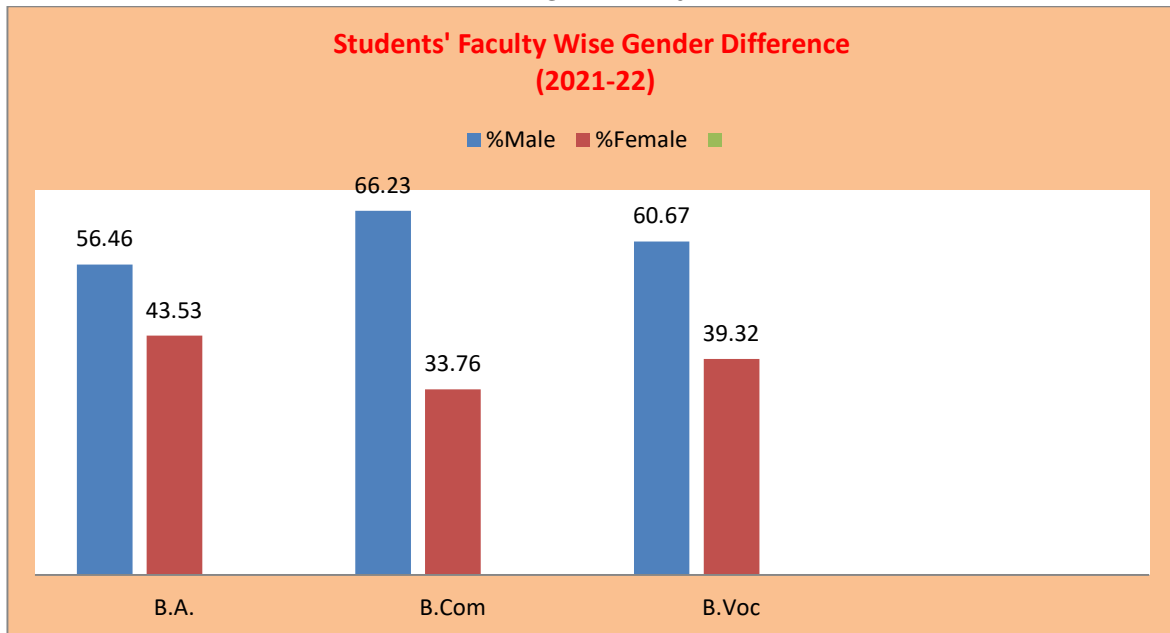

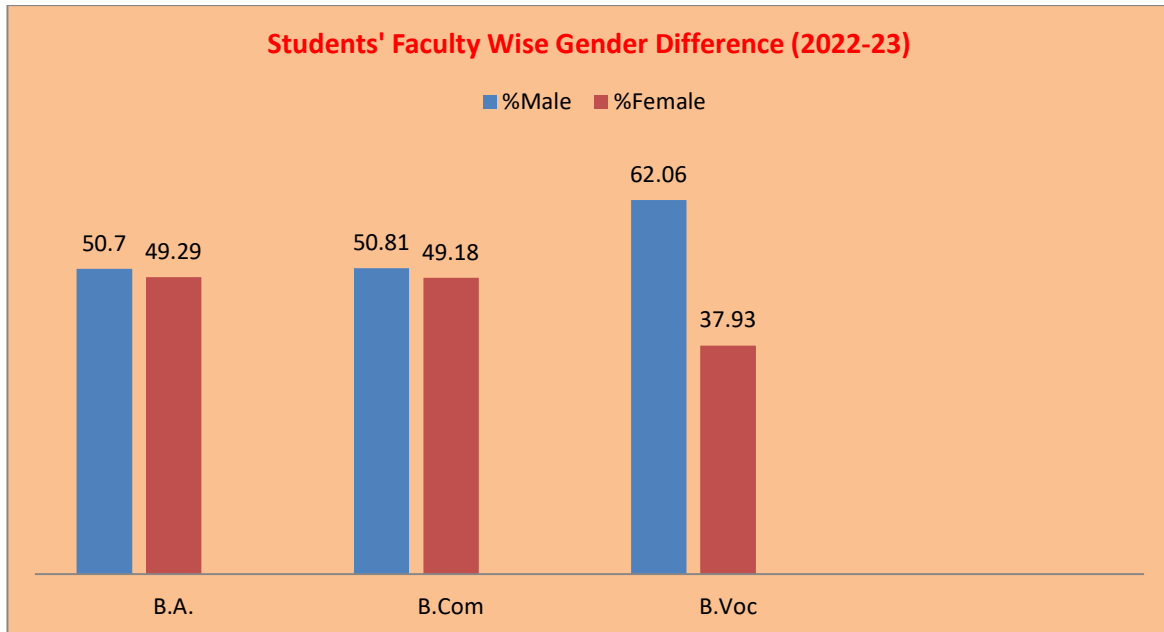

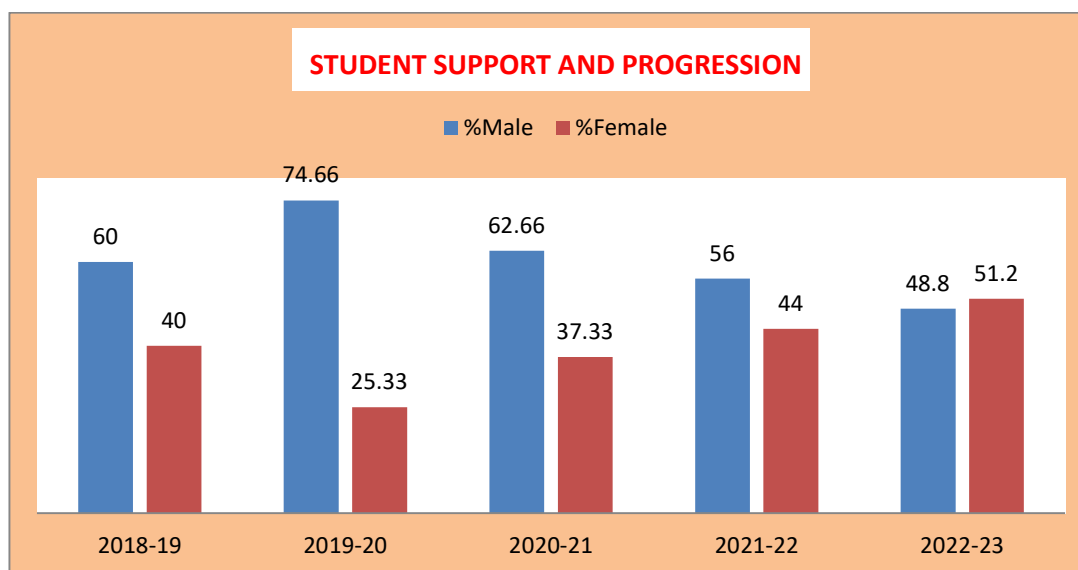

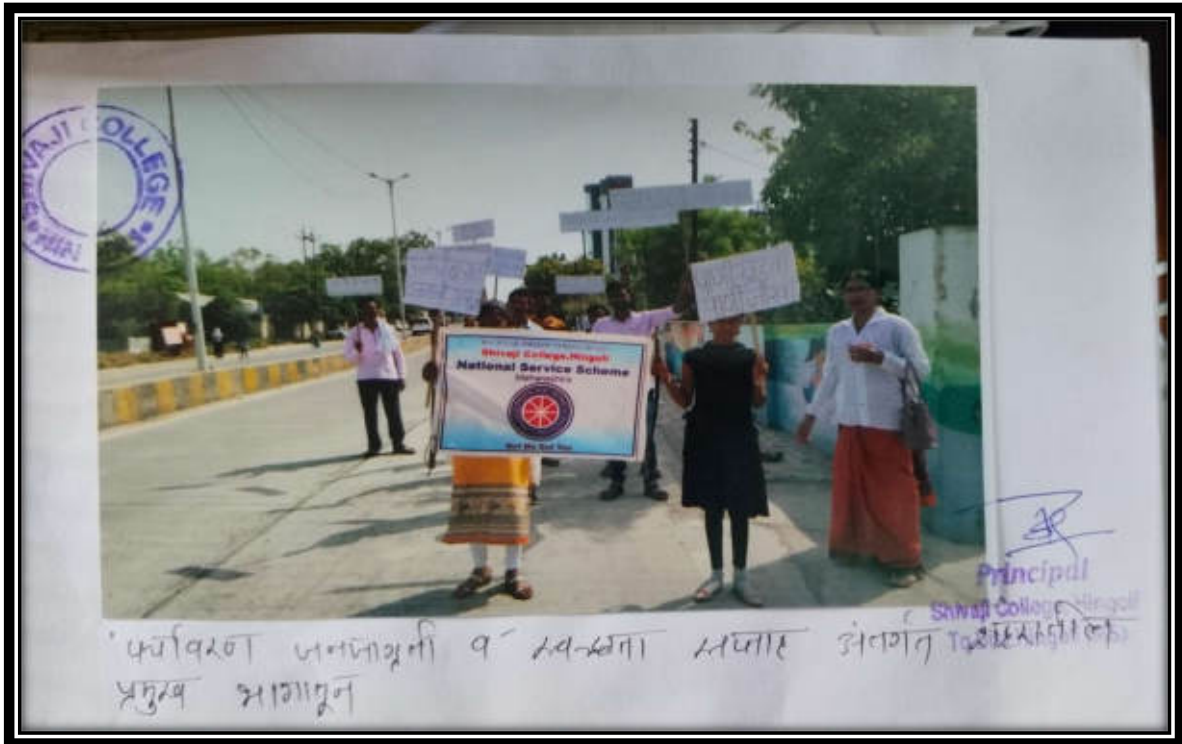
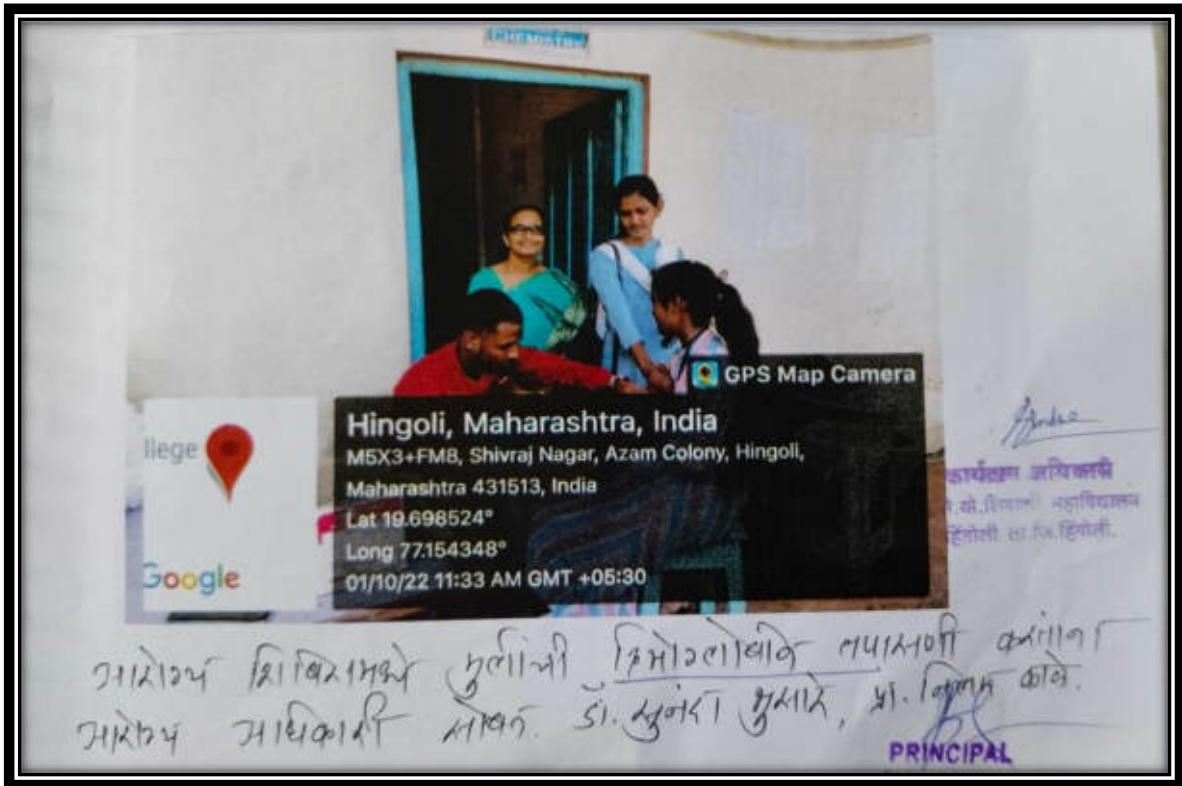
In 2022 - 2023, there were 125 students admitted. There were 61 children in 48.8 percent. There were 64 girls. Its ratio was 51.2 percent.

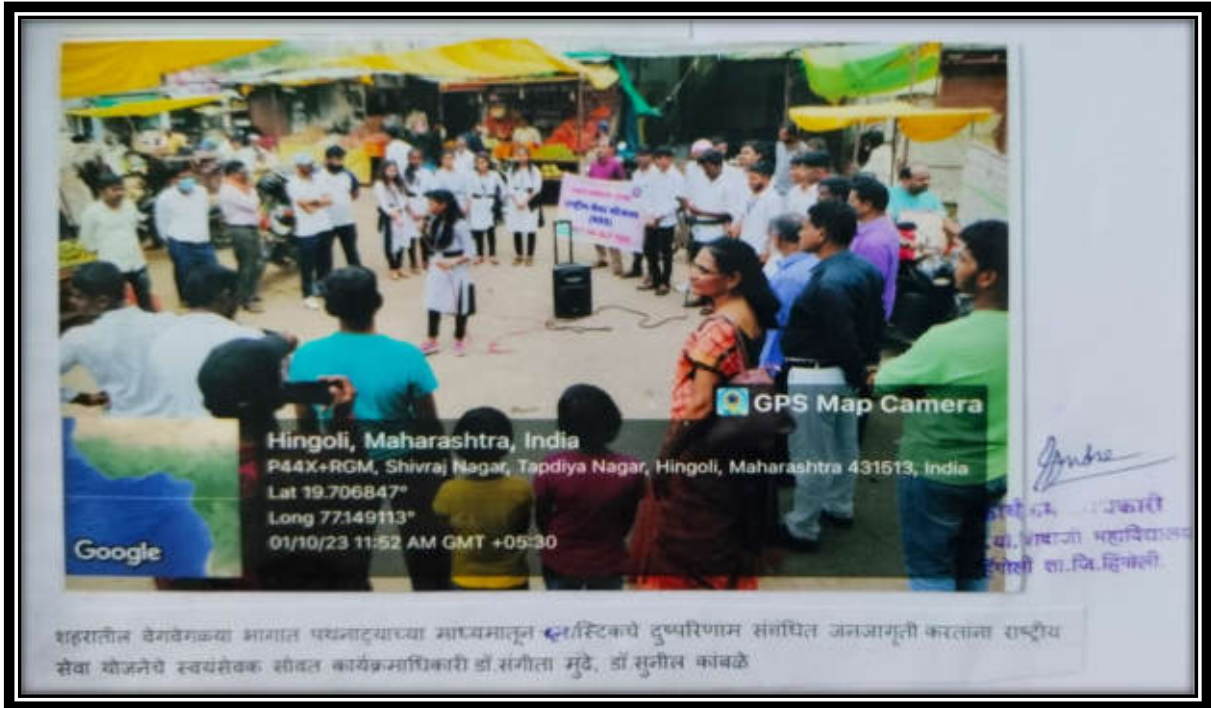
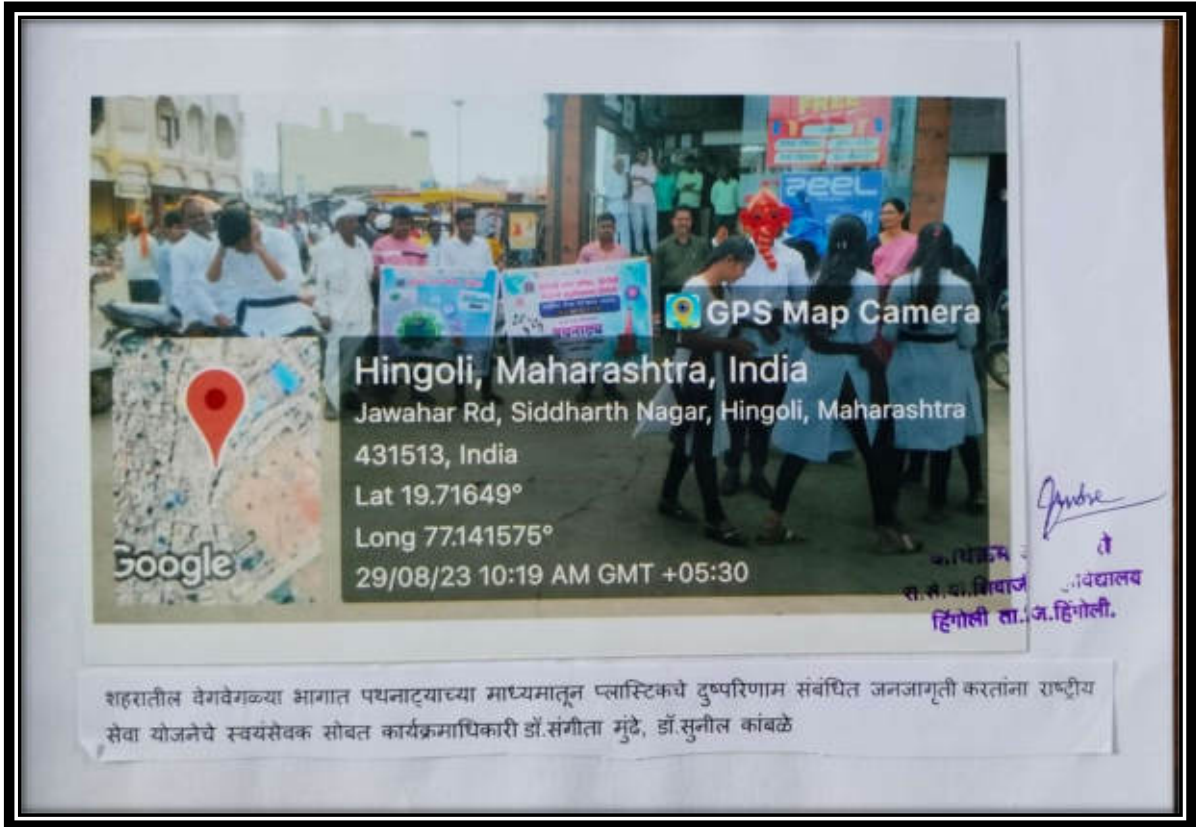

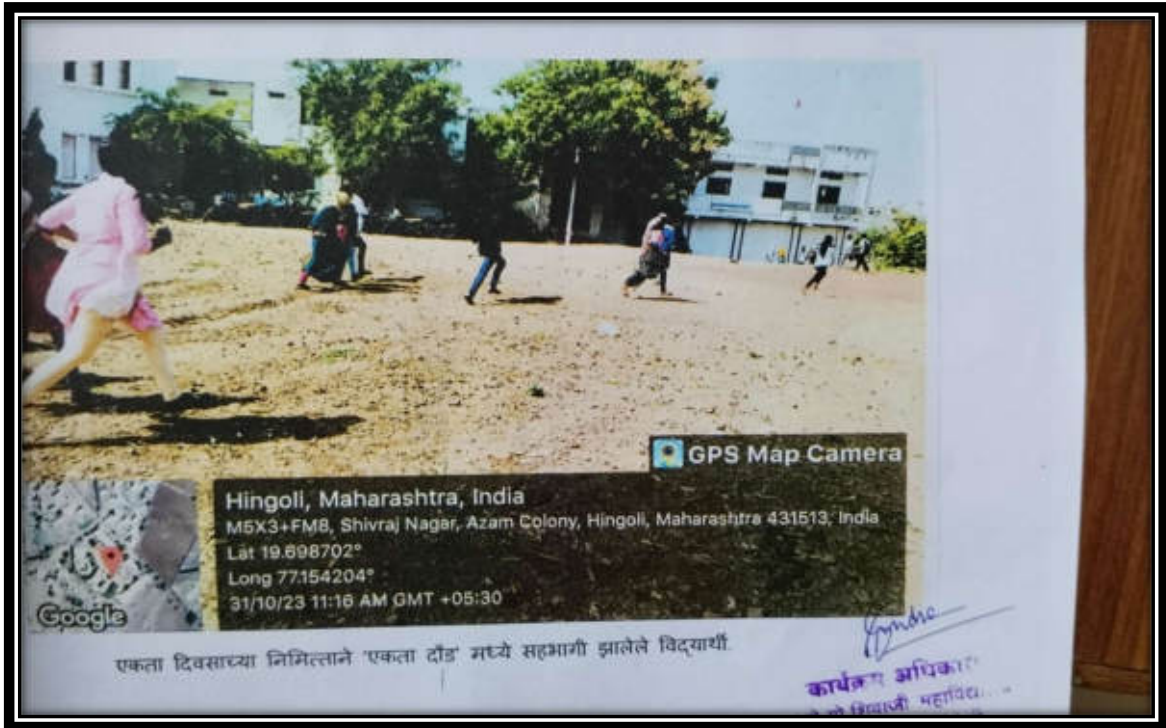












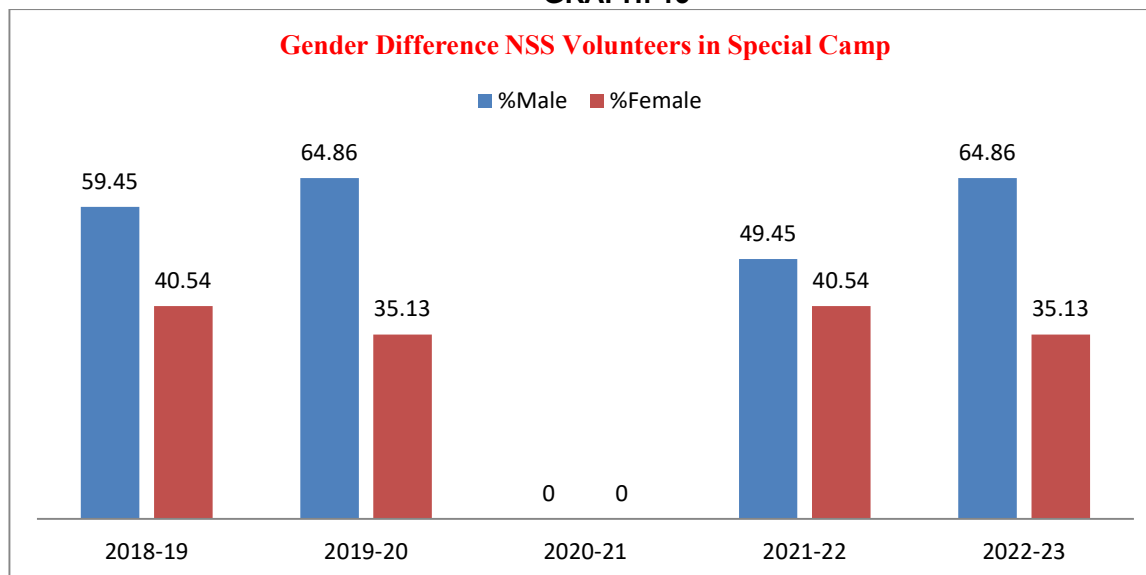
II. Gender Difference NSS Volunteers in Special Camp

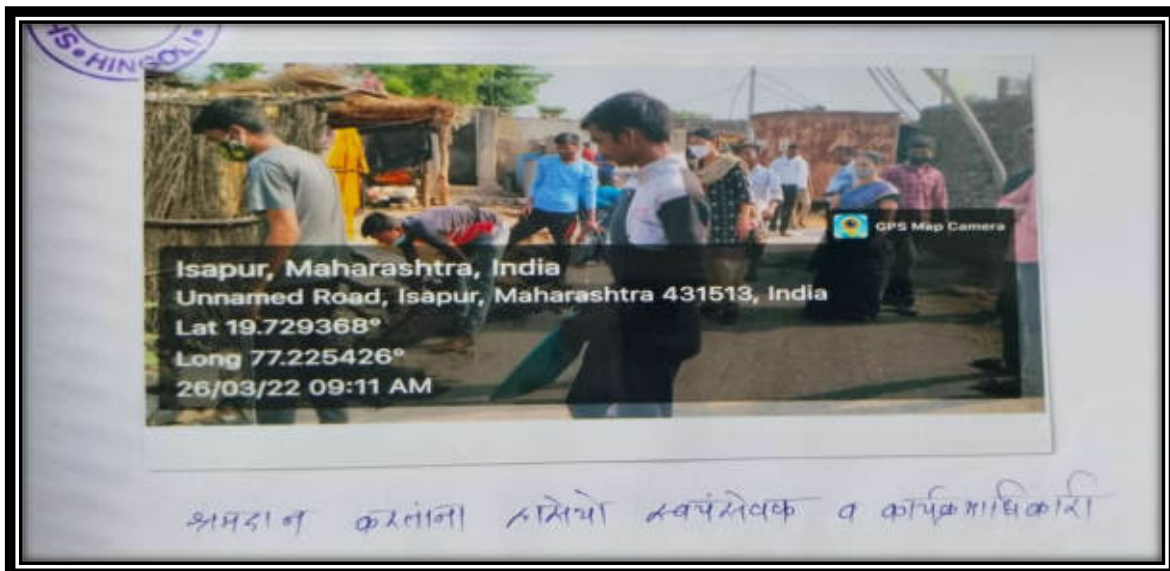
37 students participated in the special annual camp in 2018-19. There were 15 boys with total student strength of 40. 54% 2019-20. In the academic year 2019

there were 37 students participated in the special annual camp. Among them 13 girls were participated. The rate was 35.13% of the total number of students.

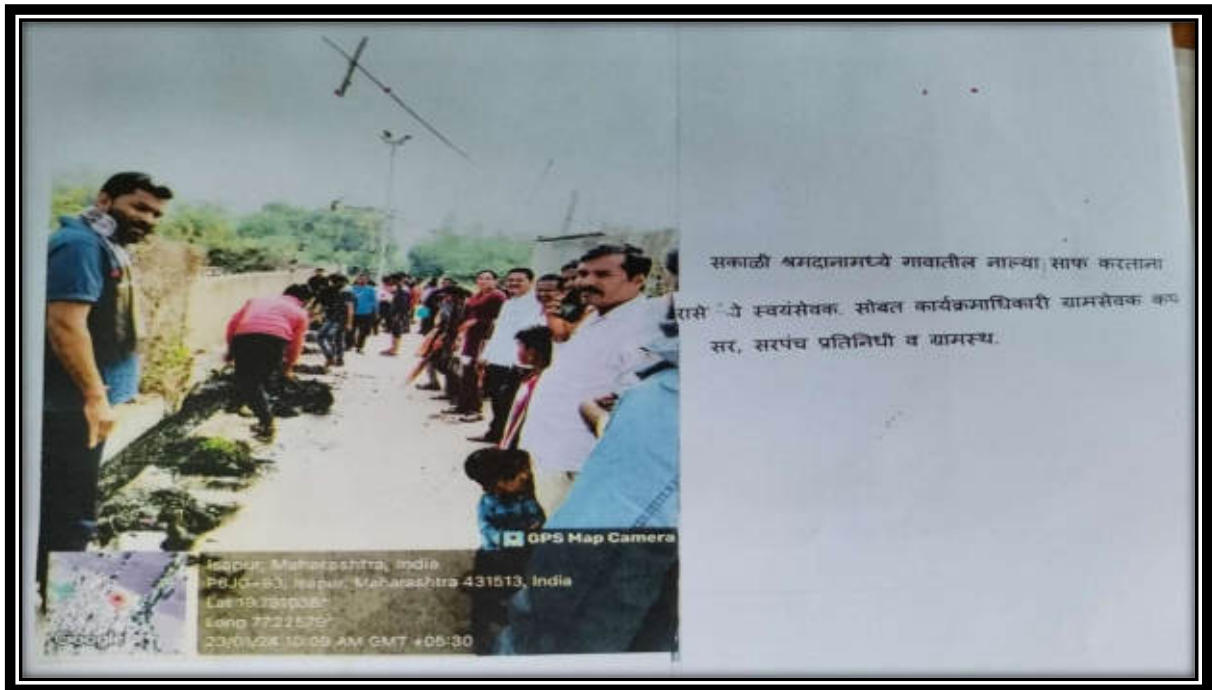


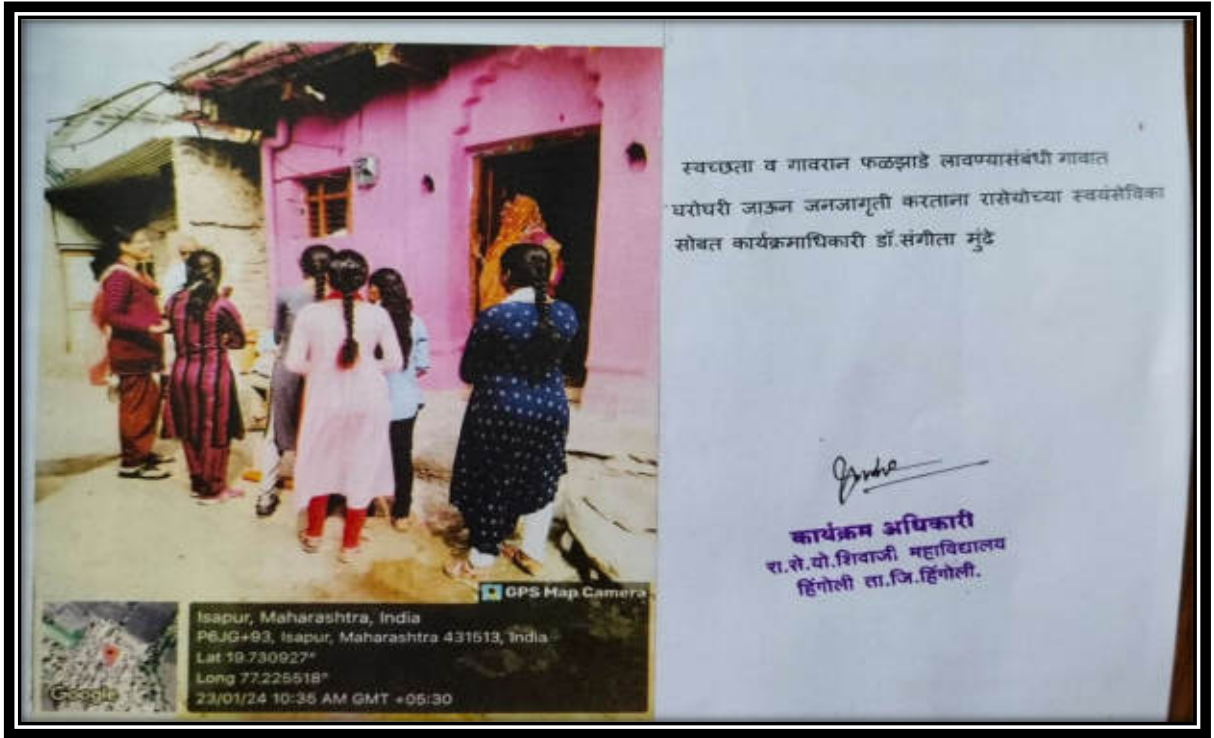
Special annual camp was not organized in the academic year 2020-21 due to corona epidemic.

In 2022 - 2023 special annual camp was attended by 37 students. Among them In 13 girls were participated, the participation rate was 35.13%.





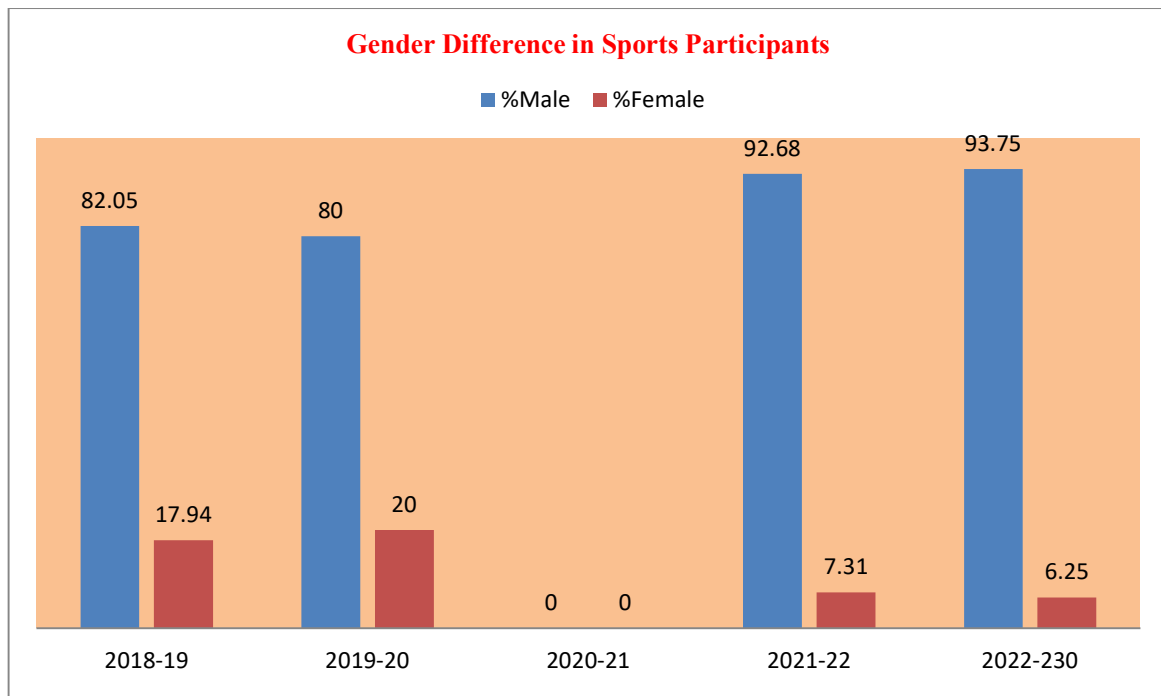
III. Gender Difference in Sports Participants

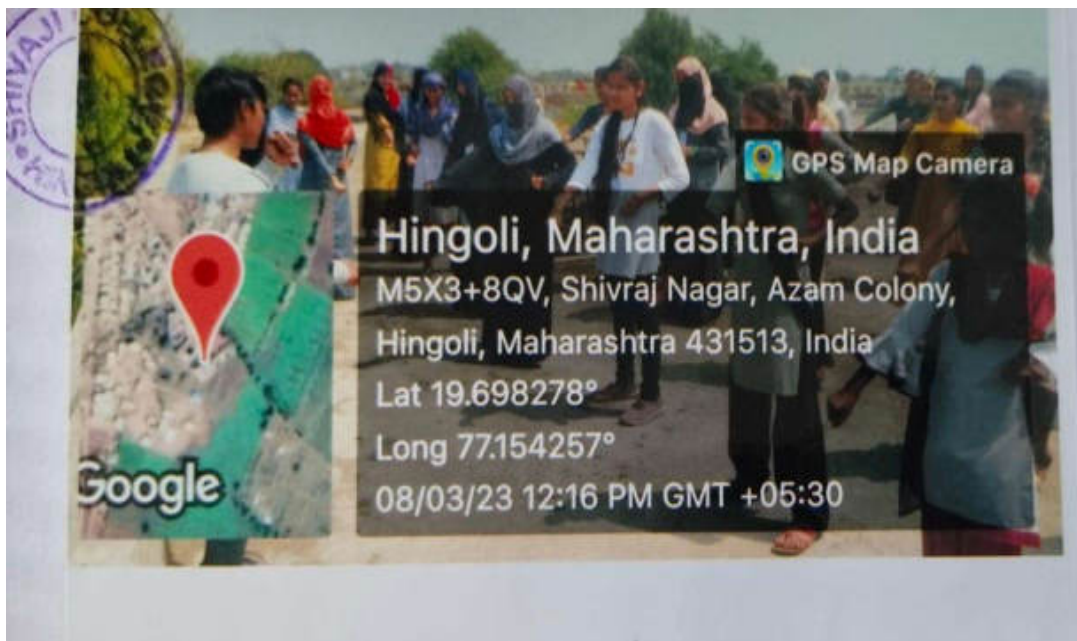

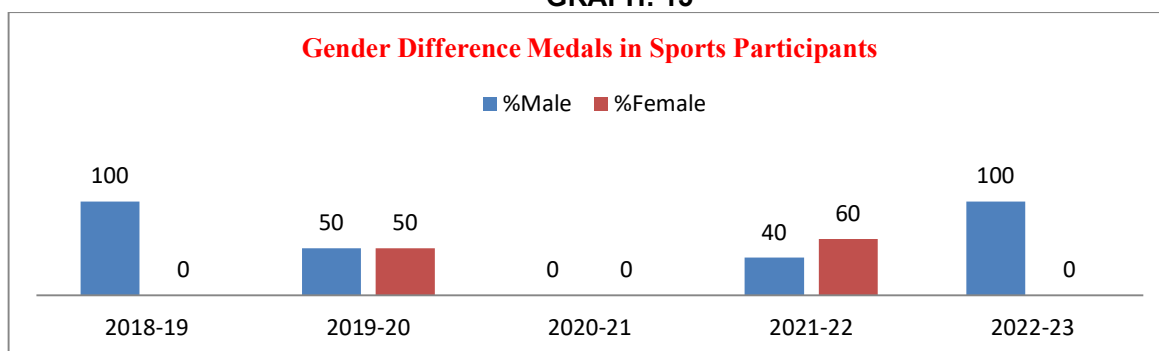
III. Gender Difference Medals in Sports Participants;-

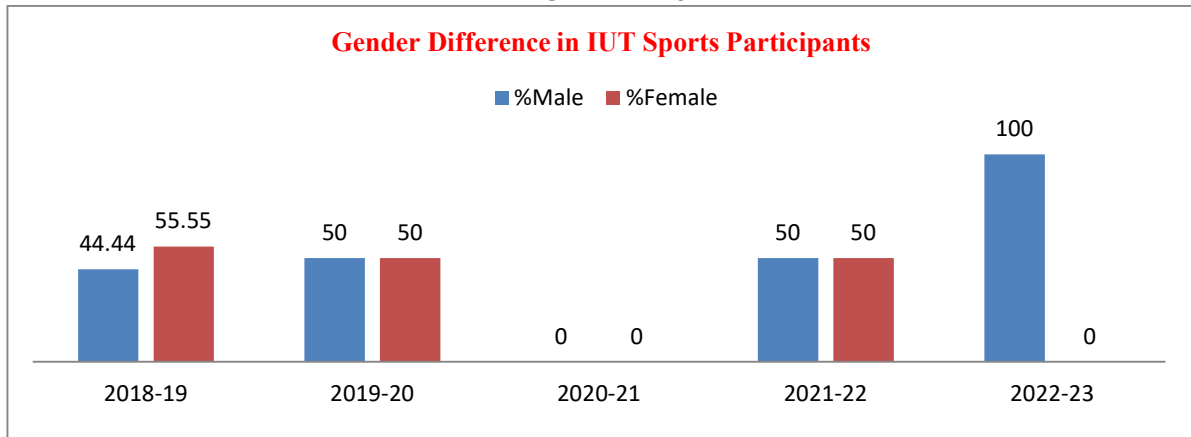

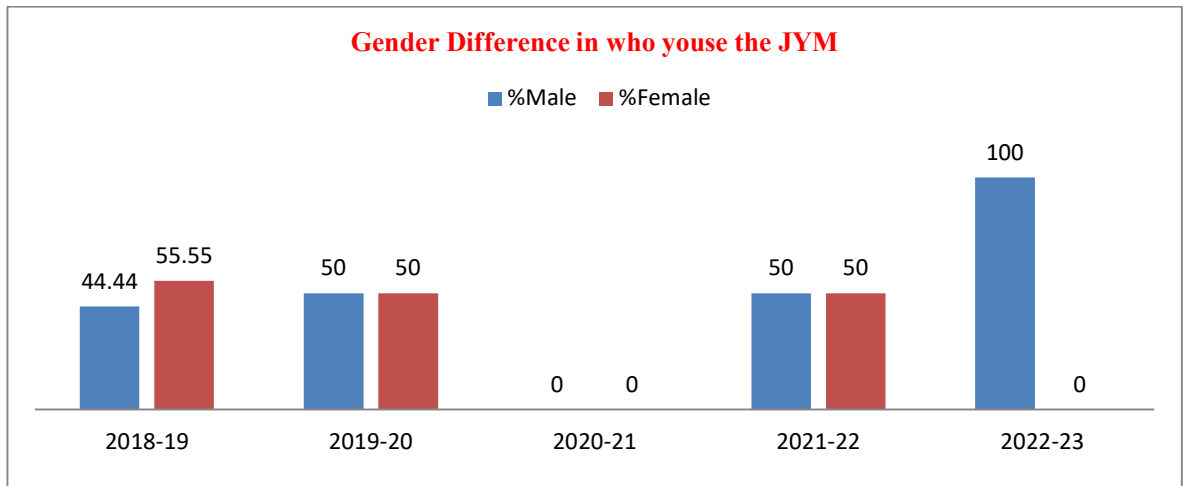

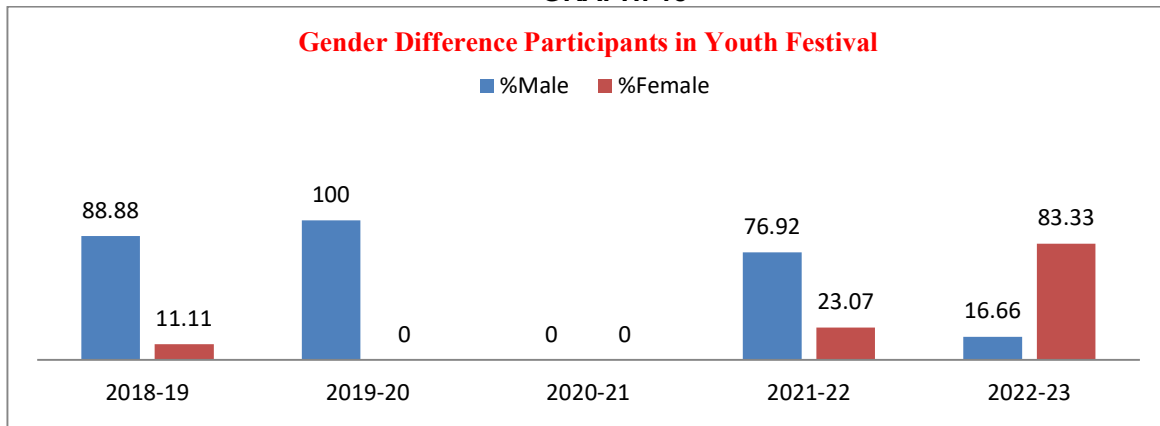
VI. Gender Difference Participants in Youth Festival

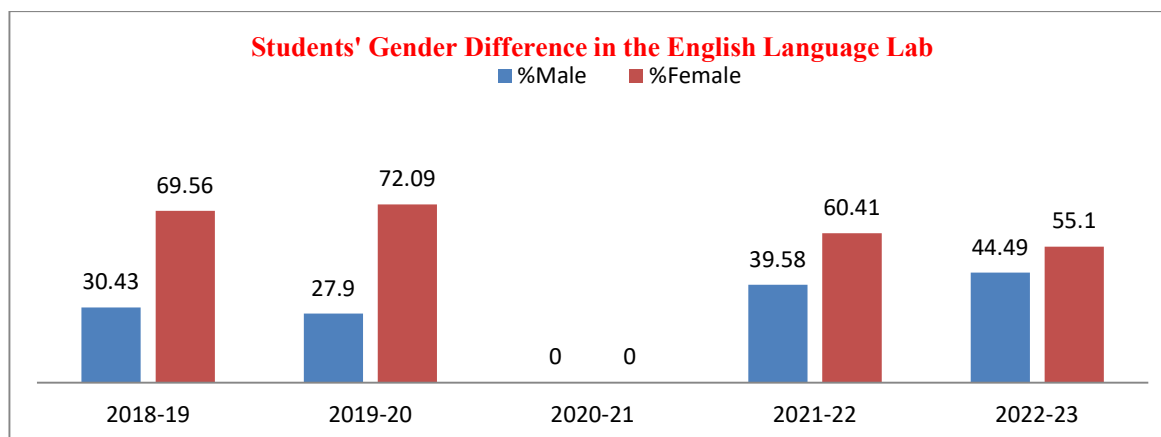

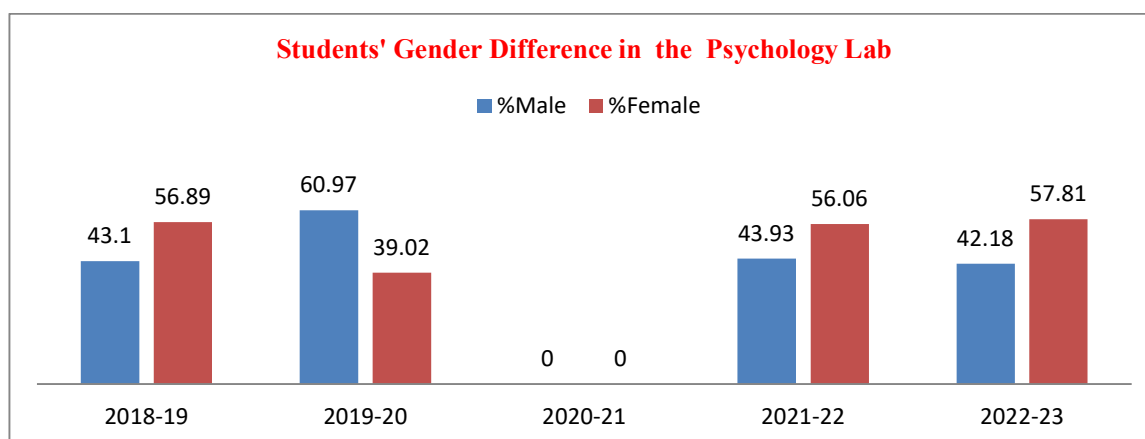

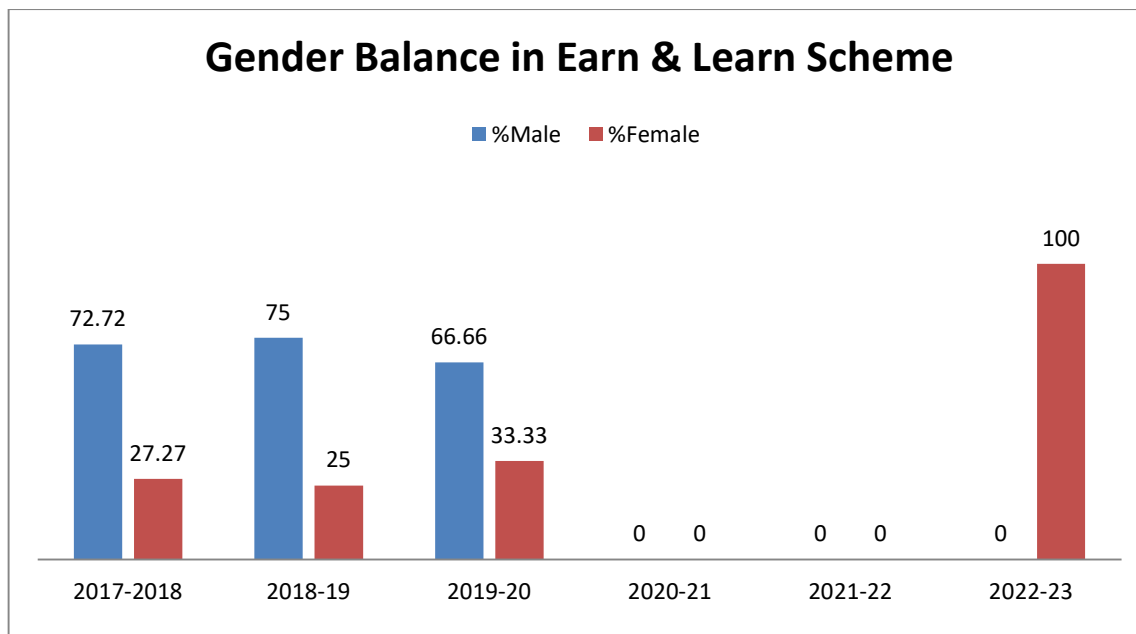
IX. Gender Balance in Earn & Learn Scheme
